JOB TITLE: SUMMER APPRENTICE WORKER

SUMMER APPRENTICE WORKERS- are High School employees that gain work experience in SchoolFood kitchens and cafeterias during the Summer Meals Program. They assist with serving meals to over 1,000 Community-Based Organizations and the children of New York City.

SchoolFood provides the Summer Apprentice Worker the opportunity of employment and to learn transferrable food-related skills.

RESPONSIBILITIES- include but are not limited to the following:

1. Preparation of meals at Open Community Feeder locations.
2. Assist SchoolFood staff by serving meals and greeting teens and youngsters as they receive their meal.
3. Learn about Meal preparation, Inventory control, SF Nutritional Standards and SF Summer Meals Program.
4. Follow sanitation procedures in all preparation areas and throughout the course of the day.
5. Meet with Teacher-in-Charge and SchoolFood Service Manager to review various duties and responsibilities that may change from day-to-day.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Candidates must be in High School from grades 9–12
- High school must be located within the 5 boroughs
- Private, Charter and Non-Public School students are eligible

PREFERRED SKILLS

- Demonstrates leadership skills
- Ability to communicate clear and concisely with peers and school administration
- Able to work with others within time constraints to complete specified tasks
- Professional, punctual and diligent

SALARY:

\$13.00 per hr. /5.5 hours per day for the duration of the Summer Meals Program (7/2/18-8/31/18).
